

- Shelf stable: milk, non-dairy oak milk, hemp milk, almond milk, soy milk
- Dairy: cheese, evaporated milk
- Spreadable: peanut butter, jelly, margarine
- Snack packs: Jell-O, pudding, fruit, chips, granola bars, cookies, peanut butter crackers, pretzel sticks, tuna/chicken salad
- Meats: Lunch meat, Spam, tuna, canned chicken, salmon,
- Household products: Laundry soap, dish soap, sanitizer wipes, paper towels
- Toiletries: shampoo, deodorant, conditioner, lotion, bath soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, disposable razors, feminine products

Joachim Neander was a dedicated, caring pastor of the Reformed Church in Düsseldorf, Germany.
