

Operation: "Let there be Sound!"



"Verily, I say unto you, blessed are those that give, for they will reap the benefit of clarity of sound, as will we all."

We have an opportunity at a serious injection of cash into our Sound System Upgrade capital campaign. An anonymous donor will match \$3000 in donations through the month of June.

All funds raised will be used for the sole purpose of upgrading the outdated system the church is currently using. This upgrade will allow for a better livestream experience and will address many of the in-person sound issues.

This campaign will run through September with an installation goal of December, just in time for Advent and Christmas.

Yes, \$31,000 is a big ask, but this is a necessary ask. Donations can be made directly by cash or check (Sound System memo line) or through the Givelify app.



All funds will be refunded, if campaign fails to reach its target minimum of \$15,000.
