#### **The Consecration**

Children are invited to fully take part, and with the following hymn may exit through the front side door to their respective classrooms for the day's planned activity.)

As Christians, we experience God's reconciling love. In response we stand with those who suffer discrimination, isolation and alienation.



Reginald Heber, 1826; alt.





This hymn by Reginald Heber was published in a book of hymns for Banbury Parish Church in England. Nicaea, one of nearly 300 tunes by John B. Dykes, was named for the famous council that defined the doctrine of the Trinity.

Jane Parker Huber's second hymn was written during a time of particular focus on language. By describing the Triune God in terms of function rather than in terms of persons, she hoped to avoid a tendency to think we know God by knowing formulas.

#### Holy God, We Praise Your Name

Anon., German, c. 1774 Transl. Clarence Alphonsus Walworth, 1853; alt. Rev. 4:8–11



This German Catholic hymn, based on the Te Deum Laudamus, appeared with this tune in a hymnal published by command of Austrian empress Maria Theresa.
