Senior High: July 30-Aug 5 - Grades 10 thru 12




Camp Tamarack Update



Episcopal priest Daniel Crane Roberts wrote this hymn for a July 4, 1876, centennial celebration at Brandon, Vermont. George W. Warren, composer of the tune, was organist at St. Thomas' Church in New York City for thirty years.
