FCCF Open and Affirming Statement


We believe that all people are sacred creations of a loving God. We affirm the diversity that exists among us.

We welcome all people to participate fully in our church's life and ministry.


We celebrate the variety of talents and perspectives which flow into our spiritual community, continuing to enrich us in ways we could not have predicted or envisioned.




